## Stockton Woman and Man Arrested for Oakdale Motel 6 Shooting

**Oakdale, CA** – Stockton woman and man arrested in connection with the October shooting at Motel 6 in Oakdale.

On October 23rd at around 2:49 a.m., officers responded to reports of gunshots and yelling in the area of the Motel 6 at 825 East "F" Street. When officers arrived, they found a man suffering from a gunshot wound. The 55-year-old victim told police a woman stole his money. He chased her to try and get his money back and was shot during the altercation. The woman then reportedly left the area in a 4-door blue sedan driven by an accomplice.

The victim was transported to a local hospital where he was treated and released. An extensive search led investigators to the internet and social media accounts related to suspected human trafficking activities. Ultimately, detectives identified 29-year-old Amanda Cumming as the shooter and 30-year-old Stephen DeLaTorre as her accomplice. DeLaTorre brought her to the Motel 6 and facilitated her get away.

Warrants were issued for the arrest of Cummings and DeLaTorre. DeLaTorre was arrested during a traffic stop last night by Stockton Unified School Police and Cumming was arrested early this morning at a hotel in Stockton by Stockton Police. Oakdale Police investigators took custody of both suspects and continued the investigation with the service of additional search warrants and evidence collection. The gun used in the shooting remains outstanding and is believed to be a 9mm handgun with a gunmetal gray appearance.

Amanda Cumming is currently facing charges of PC 664/187 Attempted Murder, PC 211 Robbery, PC 182 Conspiracy and PC 647(b) Prostitution. DeLaTorre is facing charges of PC 266i Pandering and PC 182 Conspiracy. Both are currently in the Stanislaus County Public Safety Center.
