Oakdale Police Department Holding DUI/Driver's License Checkpoint 5/13/22

Oakdale, Calif. – On May 13th, 2022 the Oakdale Police Department will conduct a driving under the influence (DUI) and driver's license checkpoint from 6:30 p.m. to 2:30 a.m. at an undisclosed location in the City of Oakdale .

DUI checkpoint locations are determined based on data showing incidents of impaired driving-related crashes. The primary purpose of DUI checkpoints is to promote public safety by taking suspected impaired drivers off the road.

"Impaired drivers put others on the road at significant risk," Chief of Police Jerry Ramar said. "Any prevention measures that reduce the number of impaired drivers on our roads significantly improves traffic safety."

The Oakdale Police Department reminds the public that impaired driving is not just from alcohol. Some prescription medications and over-the-counter drugs may interfere with driving. While medicinal and recreational marijuana are legal, driving under the influence of marijuana is illegal.

Drivers charged with a first-time DUI face an average of \$13,500 in fines and penalties, as well as a suspended license.
